

IMPORTANT INFORMATION 2009-2010

PHILOSOPHY: The Catholic Church teaches that parents are the first and best teachers of the faith. For many families, Family Program Faith Formation provides a superior process for parents to exercise their sacred responsibility to pass on the faith to their children. This approach to faith formation can be more effective, more personalized, more convenient, less time-consuming, and more rewarding for both parent and child. It can bring families together and increase the family's sense of unity with the Church. Family Program combines home study with monthly Family Program meetings which are held in the Parish Hall at Sts. John and Paul. Family Program is open to members of Sts. John and Paul and St. John Neumann parishes.

HOME STUDY COMPONENT: Children receive textbooks for home study. It is recommended that parents schedule approximately one hour of home study time during a regular day and time each week. For young children and those with learning challenges, we suggest that home study time be shorter and more frequent, with more parental assistance and less reading. Parents may elect to enhance the study experience using prayers and ideas from the "At Home Family Guide" or other supplemental resources. Chapters may be covered in any order approved by the parent.

CHAPTER REVIEW TESTS: After completing study of a chapter, the child should complete a Chapter Review Test. For students grades 1 through 5, these tests can be found online at www.faihfirfirst.com. Be sure to select the "Legacy Edition" Chapter Review when prompted. When the test is completed you will be prompted to enter an e-mail address to which the results will be sent and should enter holyfamilies@stsjohnandpaul.org. If there are any problems accessing the online Chapter Review, parents may conduct an oral review with children and simply notify us by e-mail to holyfamilies@stsjohnandpaul.org when chapters have been satisfactorily completed. Online tests are not available for children in Kindergarten. These children should simply complete the Review Questions in their textbooks and their parents should submit periodic e-mails to holyfamilies@stsjohnandpaul.org reporting the chapters that have been completed by these younger children. **Students must complete at least 70% of the Chapters in their textbook to ensure continued eligibility for the program and to receive credit for this Faith Formation year.**

FAMILY PROGRAM MEETINGS: Children participating in Family Program are also expected to attend one Family Program meeting per month (during the school year) together with at least one parent. These meetings are designed to build community spirit, renew enthusiasm, delight the senses, help everyone feel closer to God, and educate all participants. Meeting themes are based on Sunday readings for one of the weekends that month. During the first hour, families sit together and enjoy scripture, discussion, refreshments, music, skits, crafts, service projects, and/or other activities. During the second hour, children go to break-out sessions to enjoy hands-on activities directed by a Catechist for their grade-level, while adults remain in the mail hall to enjoy adult faith formation presentations. **Meeting attendance of at least 3 meetings is required to ensure continued eligibility for the program.** Due to space limitations, families are assigned to one of three Groups (A, B or C), which meet on different Sundays each month. Families will receive a schedule for their assigned dates. Please attend on your assigned date if possible. If your family cannot attend with your assigned group, it's OK to attend on an alternate weekend. Parents may elect to substitute faith-related educational events for the meetings, such as: Family Faith Events, theatrical or video productions of faith-related stories, service projects such as visiting a nursing home or collecting items for agencies that serve others in need. INCENTIVE PROGRAM: Each student will be recognized after completing the first 5 chapters in their book. After that, an award will be presented for completing the required number of Chapter Reviews (to total 17 reviews). Students who complete their ENTIRE book (all chapters) will receive a special certificate, a candy prize, and will be listed on the WALL OF FAME. All awards will be presented at the regular Family Program meetings each month.

MASS ATTENDANCE: Weekly Mass attendance and reception of Christ in the Eucharist is absolutely essential for a healthy faith life -- and MORE important than anything else. Families should attend any convenient Mass on the weekend of their meeting.

SPECIAL EVENTS: Families are encouraged to attend the Family Faith Events that will be scheduled and announced throughout the year, such as the Thanksgiving Feast Benediction, Evening Prayer for Life, Parish Reconciliation Service, and the Stations of the Cross.

DOING YOUR PART: The success of Family Program is dependent upon the generosity of the participants. There are opportunities to assist with clean-up, set-up, administrative tasks, teaching grade-level break-out sessions, music, skit production, and planning. Your active participation will make the meetings more fun for everyone.

Welcome! This flyer pertains only to families who have enrolled a child in Family Program Faith Formation, rather than Weekly Children’s Faith Formation. Over 150 families and over 200 children are expected to participate in Family Program this year. Our meetings are FUN – and attendance is high. In order to accommodate these numbers, it is necessary to offer the same Family Meeting 3 times each month. Your family will be assigned to Group A, B, or C, and you should attend the assigned Family Meeting if possible. This is particularly helpful for the children’s breakout sessions so they can develop a sense of “community” in their classrooms. When scheduling problems occur, families may attend one of the other meetings provided for the month. All Family Meetings are on Sunday mornings from 10 AM to Noon.

The binder with all of the chapter completion information will be on the same table with the meeting packets.
